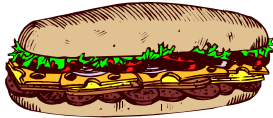

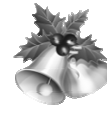


Plan For The Holidays With Scrip!

Please plan accordingly! The gift cards you order will be at church Sunday following the due date, or you can pick them up at Krystal's house beginning Wednesday after the due date.

Things to consider as you plan gift card orders:

- Buying extra food for holiday and family get-togethers
- Black Friday shopping
- Gifts you'll be purchasing for those on your list (This could be a budgeting tool: when gift cards are used up, your shopping limit has been reached!)
- Gift cards you'll be giving as gifts
- Year-end clearance sales such as Bath & Body Works or Yankee Candle

Want to help the church boost Scrip sales during the Christmas season? Please consider taking order forms into your workplace or giving them to extended family so others can do their Christmas shopping. You would be responsible for collecting the completed order forms along with their payment and handing out envelopes containing their purchase later on. Let Krystal know if you'd like order forms for distribution.

Want to see the full list of retailers? It's posted on the Scrip bulletin board or you can view it online (you do not need an account to do this) at www.shopwithscrip.com. Our order form has retailers in our area, but you might need to see those other retailers if you're buying for family on the other side of the country!

Need a plan to pay for those gift cards? You can arrange your own layaway! Pay a little at a time during the coming weeks so you don't feel the pinch in paying all at once. See Krystal to set something up.

Let the gifts you give mean even more – support missions!

We give gifts to each other at Christmas to celebrate the gift of God sending his Son. Why not give a gift card (or use a gift card when buying gifts) and having some of that amount go back to the church for missions? The gift will be reaching far beyond the individual receiving it!

- 1) Great appreciation for the congregations and delegates giving during district conference! The Friday evening offering was designated for the District Disaster Ministries and totaled \$1789.50. The Saturday offering was marked for the Ministry Scholarship Fund and the giving totaled \$1535.74.
- 2) **New Grounds Community**, a fellowship at the beginning stages in Fort Wayne and led by Sid Gauby, is looking for congregations to support their fledgling church. - 3) **The Rock Run Church of the Brethren** will hold its **47th annual Bazaar and Bake Sale** on October 29 from 8:30 - 1:00 p.m. at the church located at the corner of CR 38 and CR 33 southeast of Goshen. - 9) Please help to compile and update Camp's list of those who would be willing to serve as **medical personnel** for the **Brethren Summer Camps at Camp Mack**. Needed are 1-2 persons for the duration of each camp up to one week and 2-4 persons to help with check-in (usually Sunday) from approximately 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm. Volunteers for the week need to have a current RN, Nurse Practitioner, and/or Physician's license. Those who are helping with check-in do not. There are approximately 4-5 weeks in June, July, and the first week of August when the Brethren kids are in session. If you would be willing to have your name on the list as a possibility, please email the following information: name, address, phone number, email address, and education status by the end of November to Carol Mosson at cjmosson@geetel.net. You will be working from a fully equipped, comfortable, air-conditioned office near the heart of the camp. An EMT service is near and a doctor has provided "Standing Orders" and is available for non-emergencies. As soon as the camp dates for the Summer Program are available, those on the list will be contacted for availability. Please consider helping with this ministry. This is a much needed ministry for the summer camps and for the kids who benefit from a Christian camp experience.
- 10) **Closing of the Mount Pleasant Church** - The recent Northern Indiana District Conference agreed to the request of the Mt. Pleasant Church to close. Mt. Pleasant is the 4th oldest church on our district, chartered in 1848 as the Yellow River Church of the Brethren. Area congregations may wish to send a letter of thanks to the church for their 163 years of faithful ministry or to send a representative to the final worship service on December 25 at 10:30 am.
- 11) **Camp Mack** raised \$1546.39 for the Give a Girl a Chance program of the New Community Project through their **2011 summer offerings**. The funds will support girls' education in South Sudan, Nepal and Burma through NCP's partners in each of these countries. Costs for sending a girl to school can range from \$60 to \$300, depending on the situation. South Sudan is NCP's largest recipient, with over 150 girls receiving assistance, including hygienic materials. NCP passes on 100 percent of donations to the projects themselves, and also visits these communities on their Learning Tours. Thanks Mack!
- 12) **The Global Women's Project** of the Church of the Brethren is one of several religious groups sponsoring a new PBS series, "**Women, War, and Peace**." The series uncovers stories of women's roles in global conflict and peacemaking. It premieres Oct. 11, narrated by Matt Damon, Geena Davis, Tilda Swinton, and Alfre Woodard. Filmed in conflict zones in Afghanistan, Bosnia, Colombia, and Liberia, "Women, War, and Peace" will be aired on five consecutive Tuesday evenings through Nov. 8, at 10 p.m. (check local listings). Church Board Meeting - September 22nd, 2011

3. Commission Reports

- **Nurture** – Marge Mast:
 - Will check into ordering Song Select through CCLI (music copyright license) to get booklets of praise team songs (words and music).
- **Ministry** – Rhonda Detwiler:
 - Rhonda made a motion to rescind vote at prior Church Board regarding 1/3 of all 2012 fundraising going to Pastor salary. Seconded by Marge Mast. Motion passed. 2012 Pastor salary will still be reduced by \$1000 in order to fund VBS and LIFE through the General Fund.
- **Witness** – Gary Beasy:
 - Motion made by Gary to appoint Janet Stutzman to the Witness Commission to fill the unexpired two-year term left vacant by Marlene Brovont. Marge Mast seconded and the motion passed.
- **Trustee** – John Markham:
 - Fixed parsonage bathroom window.
 - Required water test was performed September 21st.
 - Orrin Martin (Martin's Well Drilling) met with the Elkhart Co. Health Dept. regarding the location of our new well. It will need to be at least 100 ft. away from the septic line so Martin's suggests boring underground to the new location. This will cost an \$700 more than their original quote.
- **Finance** – Steve Beasy:
 - All fundraising money in 2012 will go into the Scrip account.
 - General fund giving has leveled out and stayed even.
 - Expected earnings from Scrip will be around \$1200 per year.
 - Will soon have a form for individuals to sign for charitable tax deduction to show that they have officially donated gift card rebate to church.

4. Old Business

- **Budgets/Council:**
 - As Board Chair, Dave Fox appointed himself to the Nominating Committee for 2012.
 - Motion made by Dick Schrock to accept the slate. Motion seconded by Marge Mast and passed. Slate will be presented at Council meeting for final approval.
 - Motion made by Steve Beasy to approve the budget, seconded by Dick Schrock and passed. Budget will be presented at Council meeting for final approval.
 - 2012 District Budget as approved by District Conference was presented to the Board. The District Board intends to ask congregations for more giving to the District in 2012.
- **Great Lakes Scrip Gift Cards Fundraiser:**
 - Motion made by Steve Beasy to give \$1200 from the Eloise Witness fund to the Scrip account as a permanent base for that account. Motion was seconded by Marge Mast and passed. The Scrip acct. owes \$48.80 to the church checking account so this money will be transferred back.

5. New Business

- **Angel Food has been discontinued**
- **Madalene Anglemyer Memorial Fund:**
 - Madalene Anglemyer has left the church \$10,976.11 in her Will. Another \$100 has been donated. Although no stipulations were put on the money, her brother, Glen Anglemyer would like some of the money to be used for a specific item that the church needs, donated in Madalene's memory.
 - One suggestion is to use some of the money toward putting Praise Team songs into booklets using Song Select. Marge is checking into this.
 - Finance is in charge of deciding what to do with the rest of the money.

Church Board Meeting - October 16th, 2011

3. Commission Reports

- **Nurture** – Marge Mast:
 - Marge talked to the Nurture Commission as well as Praise Team members and the consensus was that making/ordering booklets of music and lyrics of Praise Team songs would be a waste of paper since they would want to continually add to them and they feel people prefer to see the lyrics on the screen anyway. So they will not be ordering Song Select through CCLI (music copyright license).
 - They would like to use some of the Madalene Anglemeyer Memorial money to order Welcome banners and something for the kid's program.
 - The cribs and some larger toys have been removed from the former crib room and nursery and a pack and play has been added. The CIA class has been moved to the former crib room and the fellowship hall has been opened up with the removal of the partitions formerly used for the CIA classroom.
- **Ministry** – Rhonda Detwiler:
 - Revivals went well – Rhonda thanks everyone for their help.
- **Witness** – Gary Beasy:
 - Witness will be sorting through the items in the food pantry and cleaning it out. They will give any older items to Dick Schrock to take to Family Christian Development Center.
 - \$101 of extra money from the all-church breakfasts was deposited into the Scrip account. A suggestion was made that the extra breakfast money could be used for the food pantry in lieu of being put into the Scrip account.
 - Gary will verify with Dick Schrock that the money from the raffle and water drop game are to go to the Witness Commission to use.
- **Trustee** – John Markham:
 - Speaker switch in Nursery is not working – John will check with LeRoy Cramer to see if he can fix it.
- **Finance** – Steve Beasy:
 - General fund giving average has been declining. Yellow Creek should be able to meet their 2011 budget but if the declining trend remains in place then we may fall short of our 2012 budget.
- **Deacons** - Rhonda Detwiler:
 - Will be calling Deacons again this fall.
- **Pastor Mark:**
 - Has been providing at home Communion for those unable to make it on October 2nd.
 - Has one person in Membership class during the Sunday School hour.

4. Old Business

- **Missions/Outreach Group:**
 - The Nelson's fundraiser went very well. We received \$1026.76 in profit. Some of that money is to go to Heifer Project and some is to be used for projects for the Family Christian Development Center. The remainder will go to the Witness Commission to use. Rhonda mentioned that this could be an annual event for Yellow Creek – we could even do it twice a year, possibly in February and October.
 - It was suggested that we form a Fundraiser group under Witness that can manage our fundraisers.
